

DEEPEST KIMBERLEY

A 150 km (93 miles) trek through the rugged north-western Kimberley region of Australia, culminating in the inhospitable, yet culturally rich, Cockburn Ranges.

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An ambitious journey across terrain rarely traversed on foot, this is a 150 km (93 miles) trek through the rugged north-western Kimberley region of Australia.

Overnights are in basic bush camps before tackling the untrammelled wilderness of the Cockburn Ranges.

DAY 1: DARWIN, NORTHERN TERRITORY / WYNDHAM, WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Rendez-vous in Darwin and join your flight to Wyndham, base for the vast exports of the Kimberley. Cruising by boat across the vast estuaries of the Bonaparte Gulf you find your first campsite.

DAYS 2 – 4: PENTECOST RIVER, WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Heading south in the footsteps of early pioneers, your sights are set on the mighty Cockburn Ranges. You will cover some 20 to 25 km (12 to 15 miles) per day. A vehicle

support crew will set up your bush camp each afternoon.

DAYS 5 – 6: COCKBURN RANGES

Two days of completely unsupported trekking will test the mettle of your fitness and expand your experience of true remoteness. This is 'no man's land' where very few modern people have ever set foot. The ancient rock art tells stories of the indigenous aboriginals who have lived for eons in this remarkable landscape. You will celebrate at El Questro on your last night to imbibe the camaraderie built throughout the trek.

DAY 7: DARWIN

Return to Darwin to connect with your onward flight.
